The stations are administered by professionals with expertise in water and ecology-related science. These activities are meant to introduce the complex water issues facing our community and foster an appreciation for the value of water.

Fourth and fifth grade classrooms were invited to join the festivals. Invitations were sent by USPS to every elementary school within Central's Boundaries. Central's boundaries follow the South Platte River of Adams, Weld and Morgan Counties. Districts include schools from, Brighton School District 27J, Weld Re3J – Hudson, Weld Re1- Gilcrest, Saint Vrain, Valley School District, Greeley Evans School District 6, Weld Re4 - Windsor, Weld Re 5J, Johnstown Milliken, Eaton School District, and Fort Morgan School District. There were 45-classrooms with 1,040-students in attendance at the 2023 Children's Water Festivals in Greeley and 43-classrooms with 1071- students at the fall festival at South Platte Valley Historical Park in Fort Lupton.

Goals for 2024!

Alternate Date

We hope to add an alternate date as a backup due to bad weather on the day of the festival. Moving the South Platte Valley festival to the fall will allow for an alternate date at both festivals. An alternate date is not an option with both festivals being held in the spring.

We hope to gain more sponsors from South Weld County and raise our donation level to \$25,000 for the 2024 water festivals. We will do this by promoting the festival in the Brighton, Fort Lupton, Platteville and Gilcrest areas.


Volunteers

Teachers

We met our goal of doubling the number of students at the South Platte Valley festival. Unfortunately, we had to cancel the spring festival at South Platte Valley Historic Park due to a damaging storm the night before. That cancelation was a blessing in disguise. We rescheduled and held the festival on October 11, 2023, and the weather was awesome. We will continue to hold the South Platte Valley Historic Park festival in the fall, this will allow us to have a make-up date in case of inclement weather. We will begin promoting the fall festival at the beginning of the 2024 school year; however, registration is open now. For the Poudre Learning Center location, we plan to keep the festival in the spring with the total number of students around 1200.
